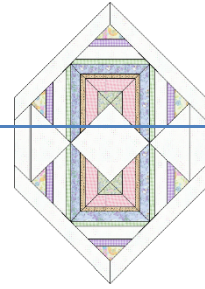


# String Theory – Table Runner

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## Second Saturday Workshop

June 2019

### General Instructions:

This runner may be made very scrappy using various different fabrics cut into multiple widths or fabric cut into even widths. Either way gives you a great affect. We will be making a runner using 7 – 8” blocks set on the diagonal. I have included examples of settings for a larger top in both diagonal and straight sets with and without sashing. Since the block is sewn on the diagonal, it can be set in the same way a “log cabin” or half square triangle are used.

Quilt Size: 24” x 36”

Block size: 7” finished (But, you can make it any size you want just remember to adjust the yardage amounts)

### Yardage:

- **Strips:** Approximately 1 yard of a variety of fabric cut into various widths. (1 ¼” to 2”) I recommend no wider than 2” unless you want to accent the corners. Fat quarters will work as the longest cut will be 13”. Or, bring your scrap basket (we all have one) and make it a truly scrappy top.
- **Background/border fabric:** cut one (1) square the size of your unfinished block plus three (3) - 2 ½” strips WOF.
- **Binding:** ½ yard if you are not using the background. This can also be made using scraps.
- Approximately ¾ yard of light weight **muslin** or “**Pattern Ease**” by Pellon.
  - Wash the **muslin** to take care of any shrinkage and press well. **Do not wash “Pattern Ease”**. Cut the muslin or “Pattern Ease” into squares 1 ½” larger than the finished size. (For an 8” finished cut 9 ½” squares) We will square these after all are sewn.
- **Supplies:**
  - Marking tool of your choice. Purple air, Blue washout or chalk will work. Pencil is fine for darker fabrics but, I don’t recommend it for lighter fabrics.
  - Rotary cutter, square up rulers etc... The usual supplies.
  - Neutral thread to blend with your fabrics.
  - Small cutting mat. Ironing mat if you have one with craft or travel iron.
